**HOW LONG SHOULD I STAY HOME IF I'M SICK??**

CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.) Stay away from others as much as possible to keep from making others sick. Continue to cover coughs and sneezes and wash hands even after you return to school. It is important to know that even if you don't have a fever, you may have the flu and be contagious if you get flu symptoms. A fever is considered to be 100.6°. If a child has vomited or has had diarrhea the evening before, your child must be at home for one full day. Parents are asked to notify the school by 8:30 a.m. when their child is ill. Parents will be asked for symptoms their child is experiencing, because these are reported to the health center weekly.
